

#### **GROUND HANDLING OF AIRCRAFT**

If you read last month's FLIGHTFAX 5 you learned that the Army has experienced seven ground handling mishaps in the last five years that cost nearly one million dollars. These preventable accidents impede aircraft availability and are unscheduled maintenance actions no organization wants to deal with.

Procedures for towing Army aircraft are found in the applicable maintenance manuals (IETM/AMM) and TM 1-1500-204-23-1 (General Aircraft Maintenance).

Numbers of personnel required for towing specified in aircraft IETMs vary for each MDS. The General Aircraft Maintenance manual provides procedures for all ground movements. The manual refers users to applicable maintenance manuals for towing and provides general procedures for towing of all aircraft.

Push aircraft by hand (when required) in accordance with the applicable maintenance manual and follow the procedures in the General Maintenance Manual. Personnel that are actively involved in pushing the aircraft are not performing any of the other required duties for safe aircraft movement.

Ensure Standard Army Towing System operators are selected, trained, tested/licensed in accordance with AR 600-55 and properly integrated into your flight line driving program. Last year's February issue of Flightfax has an excellent article on flight-line driving programs if you would like to learn more.
